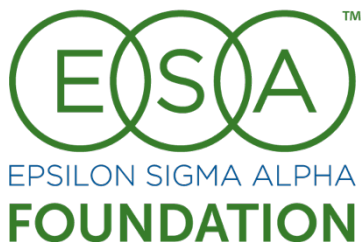

Thanks to everyone who has contributed to the Foundation this year, utilizing the Turn around Fund, paying for your membership and contributions to various endowments.

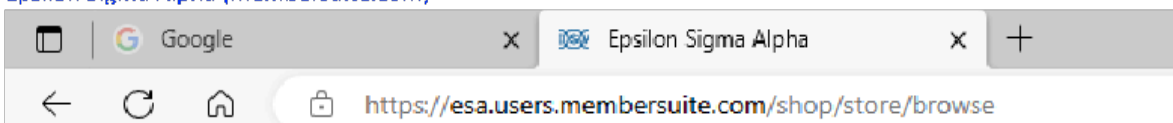
Updates:

If you have questions about accessing the application process, please contact me. Please encourage your schools and students to apply soon. The season closes February 28.

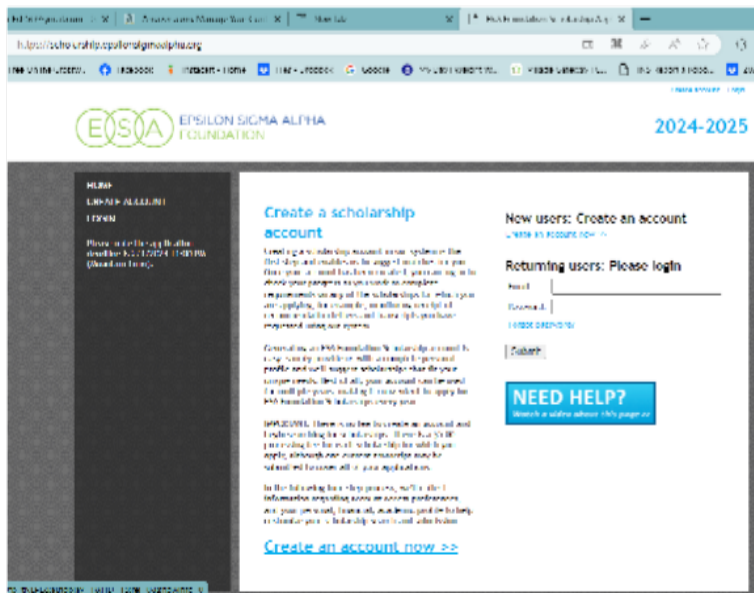

For all of our crafty members - there will be tables set up where you can sell your craft items

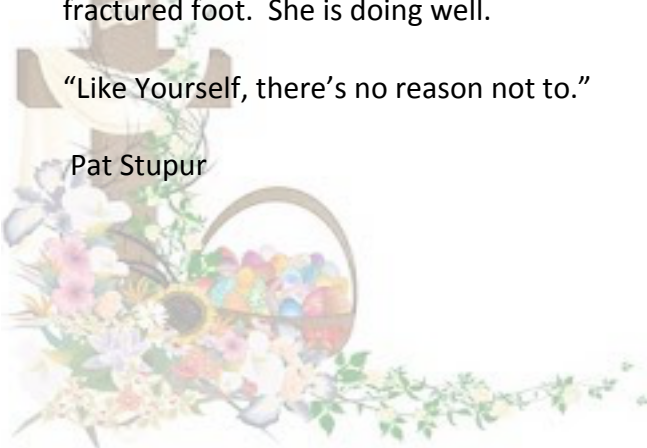
For all of our not as crafty members - this is your opportunity to purchase those craft items

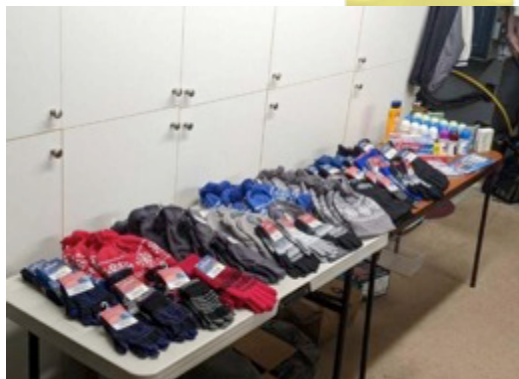

One of the things we discussed was only holding two (2) meetings a year. We are only three (3) chapters now and this would help with rotation. We are continuing to think about this!



Willamette Valley District Members

Flag Proposal

Joy Serkowney and I proposed at Convention 2023 that Oregon State Council research the prospect of replacing the following flags from the standard size to a smaller size.

The flags to be replaced are:

ESA Banner	Central District
ESA Foundation	Douglas District
All Faiths Flag	Eastern District
St Jude	Northwest District
Easter Seals	Southern District
Western States	Willamette Valley District

The Flag Ceremony Chair would be responsible for all flags thereby eliminating the stress, worry and hassle of trying to find flags, flag stands and remembering who had it last.

Questions, comments from the assembly:

1. What do we do with the old flags?
2. If we realign the districts and change the names, now is a good time to do this.
3. What size would the new smaller flags be?

In researching this, Joy and I have the following to report:

- Most printing companies have set supply catalogs that they use, in looking through those none offer reduced size flags of any size.
- Printing costs vary however all are per color with additional fee for digitalizing the picture then a set-up fee per unique print job – per flag.
 - Charge per color plus digitalizing fee range between \$19-\$24, this would total \$234 plus the set-up fee per flag.

What we are suggesting is to:

1. Ask everybody currently with the listed flags to bring to Winter Meeting.
2. Sandy Diess to take the flags and photograph them.
3. Print the flags ourselves on standard fabric printing sheets of 8 ½ x 11". the fabric print sheets are 30 for \$35.02, which is \$1.17 each.
4. The cost of ink (\$37.99 for 2 black and 3 color cartridges), if completely used would be \$1.58 per flag. This cost would be pro-rated per flag of the ink used.
5. All flags can be double sided, sewn together and attached to a dowel rod.
6. Find a nice person to make a curved display stand – either one for all 12 flags or 2 for 6 flags each.
7. Cost of double-sided flags:

fabric sheet	\$1.17 x 2 = \$2.34
ink	\$1.58 x 2 = \$3.16
Total per flag	\$5.50 plus cost of dowel rod & stand

Answers to questions from the assembly:

1. What do we do with the old flags? They can be either kept by the members of the district or turned into the Archives.
2. If we realign the districts and change the names, now is a good time to do this.
3. What size would the new smaller flags be? 8 ½ x 11"

Lots to do and see in San Diego
